The **Summer 2010 Application For Financial Assistance** is now available. **The deadline is Monday, May 3, 2010, at 5 PM. This is a firm deadline.** Students who attend the 2010 Summer Experience Program may qualify for financial assistance such as Federal Pell Grants or Federal loans, but they must meet this deadline in order to do so.

Students who wish to receive summer financial assistance must do the following:

- Have a **2009-10** Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) on file with High Point University no later than May 3, 2010. FAFSAs can be filed at www.fafsa.ed.gov. **PLEASE NOTE: The 2009-10 FAFSA is necessary to process summer aid because Summer 2010 is a part of the 2009-10 academic year. This is different than the 2010-11 FAFSA required for the 2010-11 academic year. Students who have filed the 2010-11 FAFSA must also file the 2009-10 FAFSA if they wish to receive assistance for Summer 2010.** The 2010-11 FAFSA applies to Fall 2010, Spring 2011, and/or Summer 2011 only.
- File the **Summer 2010 Application for Financial Assistance** with the Office of Student Financial Planning **NO LATER than Monday, May 3, 2010**. Even if a student has a 2009-10 FAFSA on file, no summer aid will be processed without the **Summer 2010 Application for Financial Assistance**. Students must follow all of the instructions and meet all of the requirements on this form.
- Have remaining eligibility for Federal student loans and/or Federal Pell Grant. Because Summer 2010 is a part of the 2009-10 academic year, only leftover Federal eligibility, if any, is awarded during summer. The Office of Student Financial Planning will determine the student's remaining eligibility, if any, through the student's submission of the **Summer 2010 Application for Financial Assistance**.

This form serves as your official application for financial assistance for the Summer 2010 term at High Point University. Because most students use part or all of their eligibility for assistance during the regular academic year (i.e. Fall and/or Spring semesters), the only assistance available during the summer is the “left over” amount of Federal aid not used during the regular academic year. You may or may not qualify to receive any summer assistance if you have received aid during the 2009-2010 academic year. When you submit this form, we will determine your eligibility for any remaining assistance and will notify you of your eligibility.

You MUST meet ALL of the following terms and conditions in order to receive any assistance during Summer 2010:

- You **MUST file this form IN THE STUDENT FINANCIAL PLANNING OFFICE NO LATER THAN MAY 3, 2010, AT 5 PM.** If you fail to submit this application by the deadline, we will not be able to process any financial assistance for you.
- You must already have completed a **2009-2010 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA)**, and you must have High Point University (Title IV School Code 002933) listed on the FAFSA to receive the results.
- You must indicate the **MAXIMUM** number of credit hours you will take this summer on the back of this form. When in doubt, tell us the **MOST** you will take. It is not necessary for you to contact our office to notify us of schedule changes. We will adjust your award after the drop/add period(s) to reflect your eligibility based on the actual number of hours you have. **PLEASE KEEP IN MIND THAT YOUR AWARD MAY BE REDUCED OR CANCELLED WITHOUT PRIOR NOTICE IF YOU DROP OR WITHDRAW FROM CLASSES.**
- You must be a degree, or certificate-seeking student at High Point University, and you must be enrolled at least half time during the summer (i.e. six credit hours or more for undergraduate students and three credit hours or more for graduate students).
