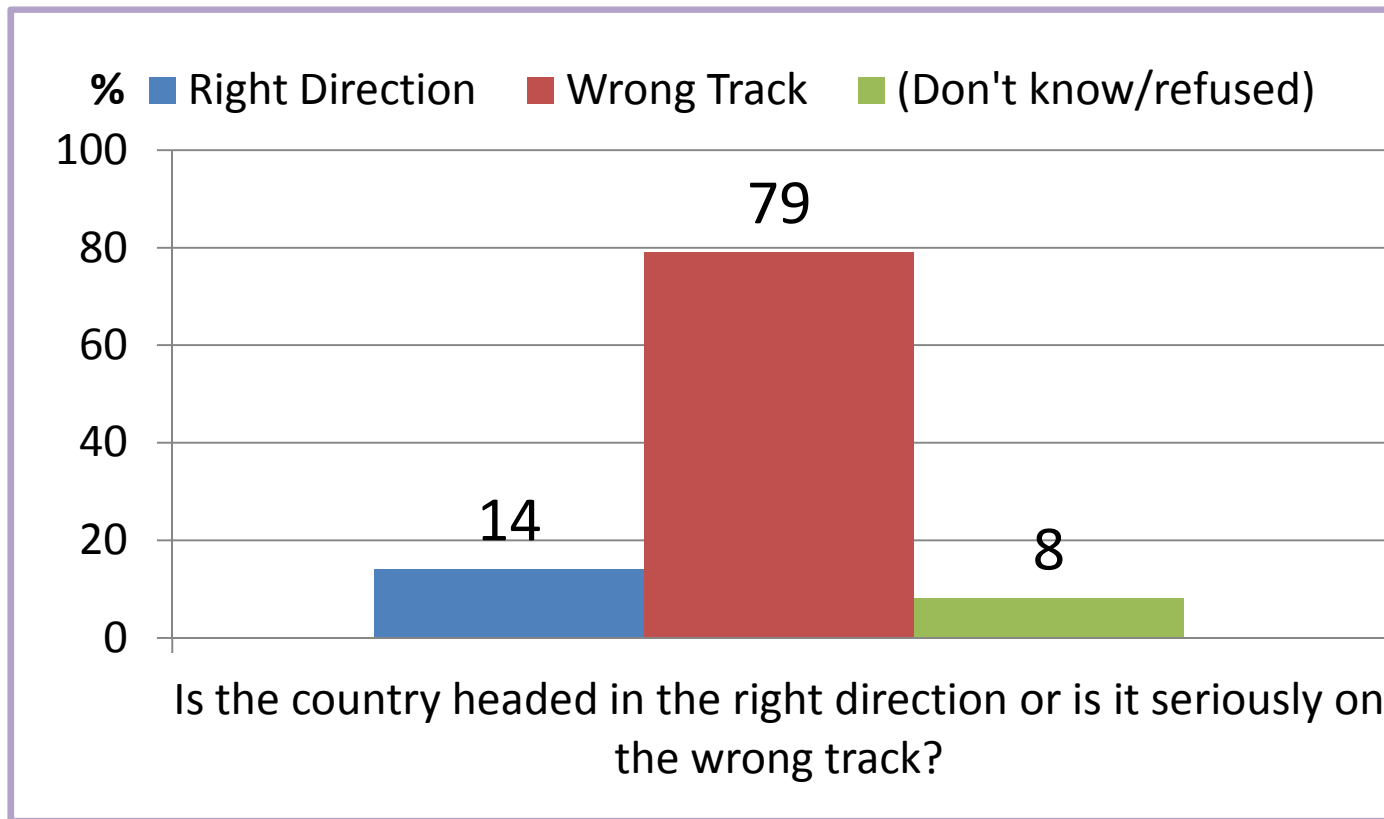

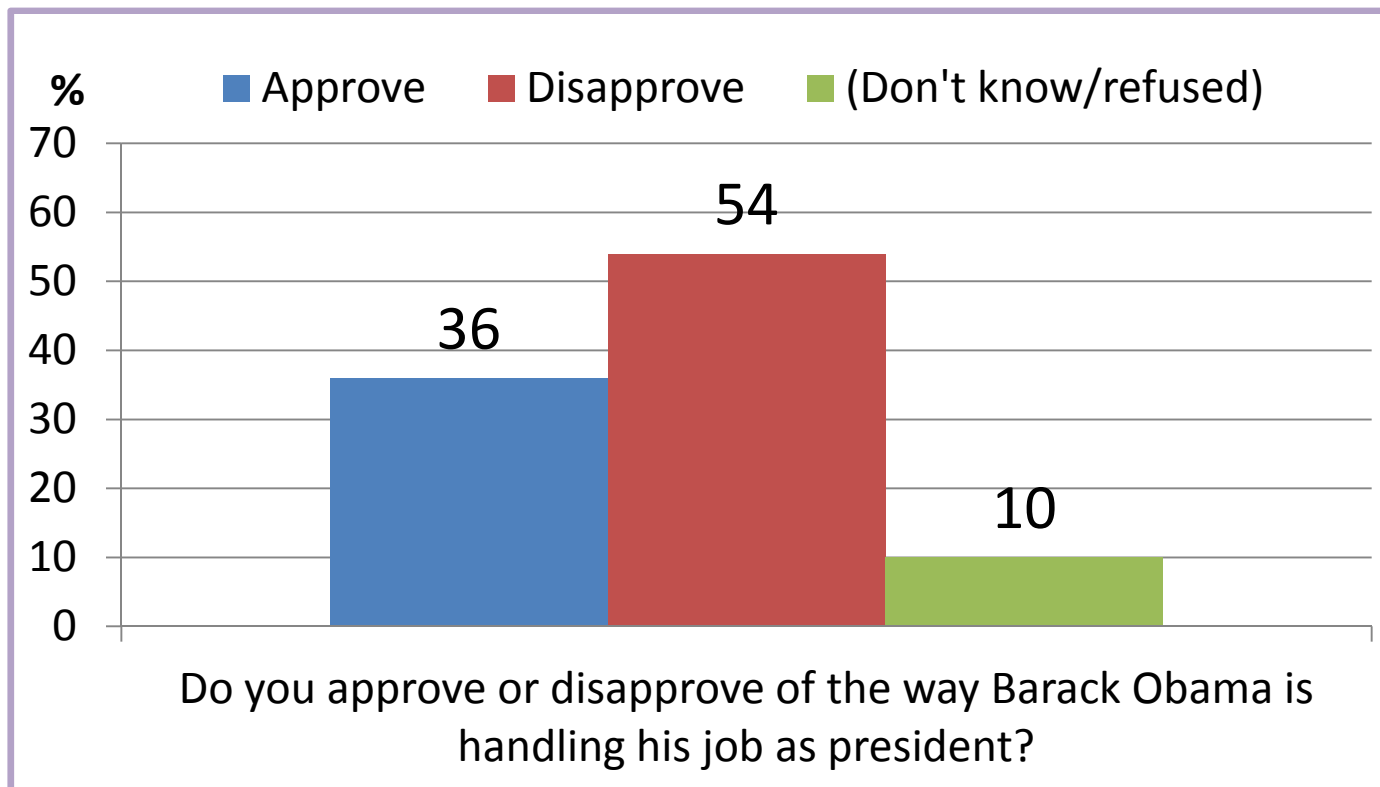
METHODOLOGY

- 408 adults (age 18 and older) in North Carolina
- The survey was conducted October 2 – 6, 2011
- The sample is weighted to Census estimates of demographics of North Carolina's population
- Estimated margin of sampling error is approximately 5 percent

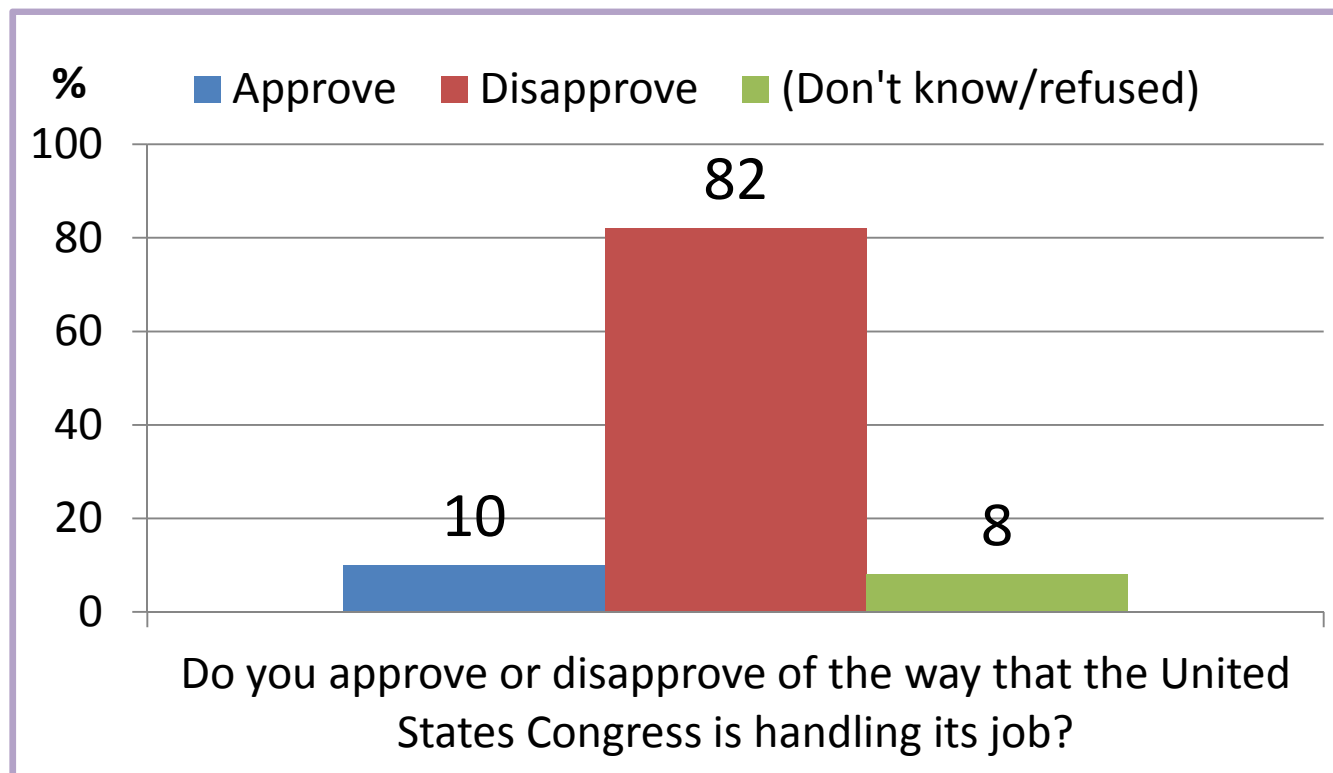
LARGE MAJORITY IN NC SAYS COUNTRY IS ON THE WRONG TRACK



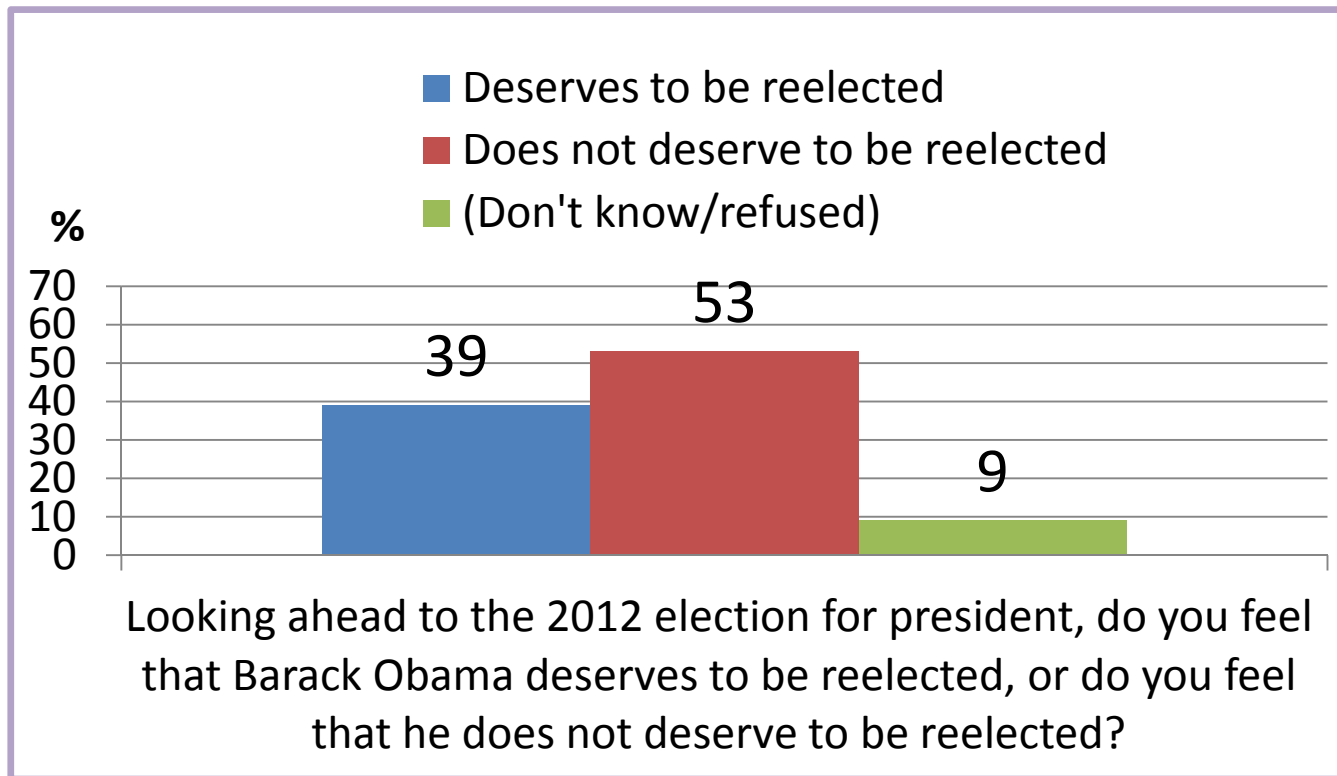
MAJORITY OF NORTH CAROLINIANS DISAPPROVE OF HOW PRESIDENT OBAMA IS HANDLING HIS JOB



MAJORITY IN NC DISAPPROVE OF THE WAY THE UNITED STATES CONGRESS IS HANDLING ITS JOB

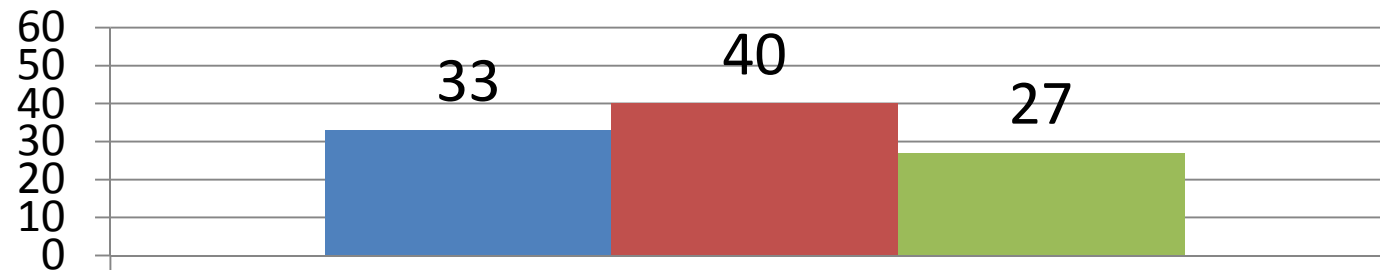


MAJORITY IN NC SAYS BARACK OBAMA DOES NOT DESERVE TO BE REELECTED



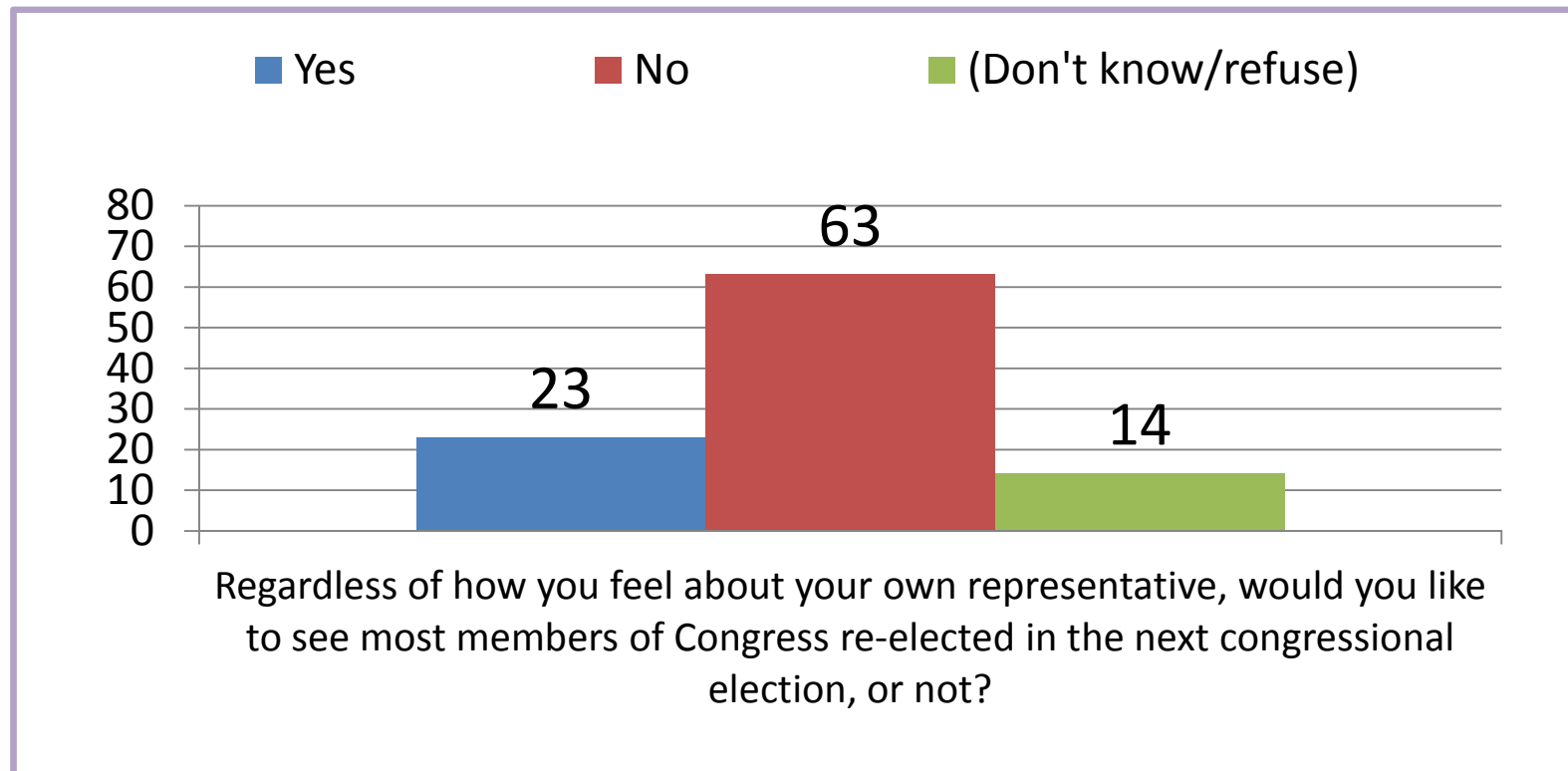
PLURALITY WOULD NOT LIKE THEIR REPRESENTATIVE IN THE U.S. CONGRESS TO BE REELECTED

■ (Don't know/refuse)

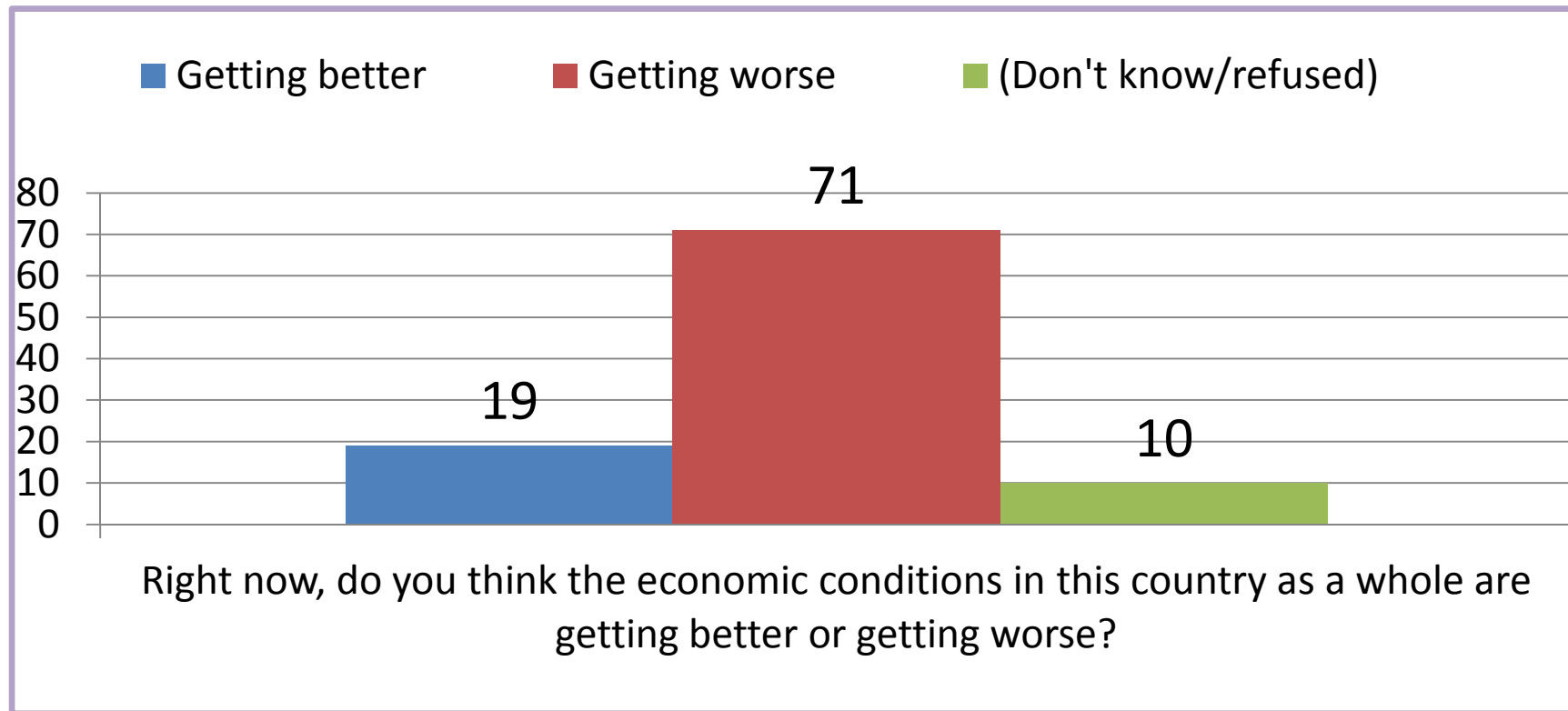


Looking ahead to the 2012 election for U.S. Congress, do you feel that your representative deserves to be reelected, or do you feel that your representative does not deserve to be reelected?

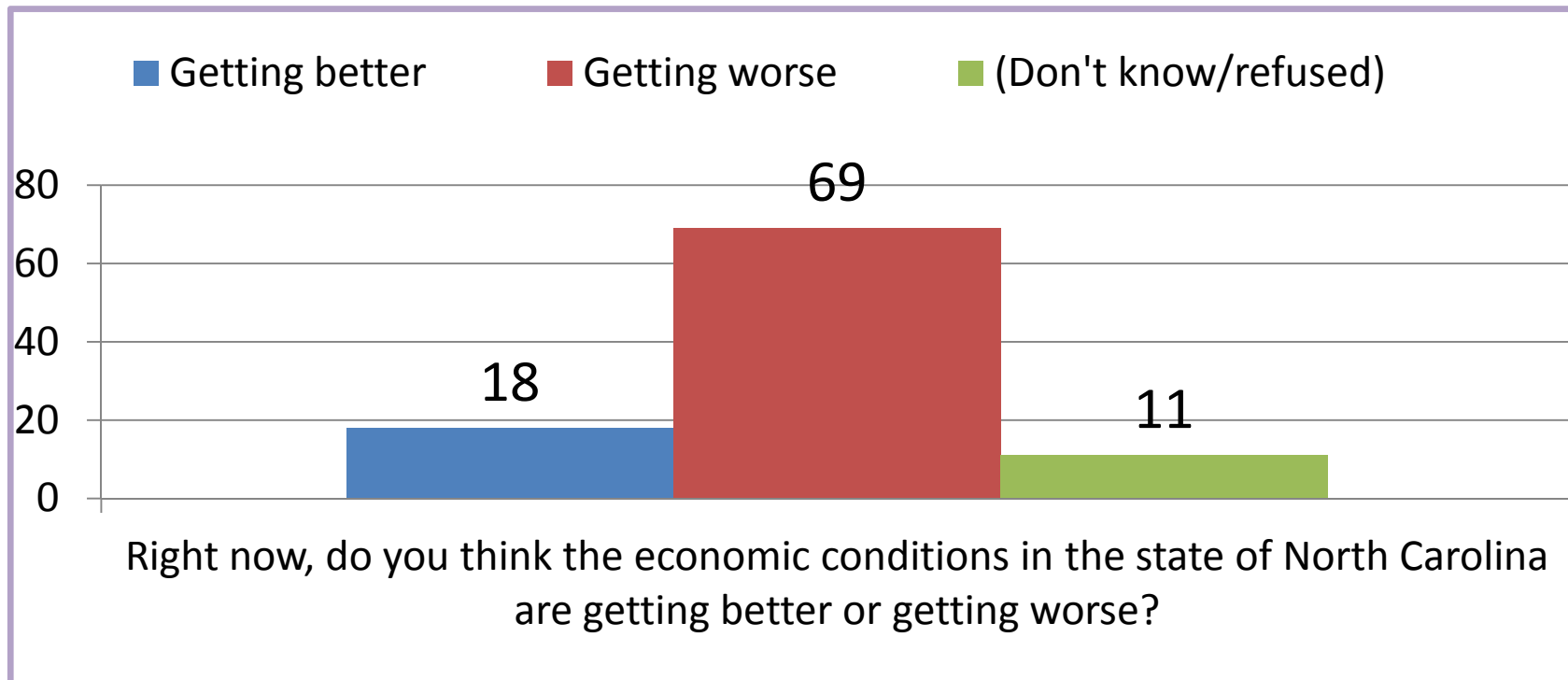
MAJORITY IN NC WOULD NOT LIKE MOST MEMBERS OF CONGRESS TO BE REELECTED
