MEMO RELEASE 11/6/2018 (UPDATE)**

ELEMENTS	DETAILS
Population represented	Adults (people over the age of 18) in North Carolina.
Sample size	842 adults in North Carolina (680 self-identified registered voters, 585 individuals who said they were "Almost Certain" to vote or had already voted).
Mode of data collection	285 live interviewer telephone (Random Digit Dial (RDD) landline and cellular telephones) interviews. 557 online interviews. All interviews conducted in English.
Type of sample (probability/non-probability)	Probability, using RDD samples of landline and cellular telephones generated by Survey Sampling International.
Start and end dates of data collection	October 26 2018 – November 1 2018.
Margin of sampling error for total sample	This is a combined sample of live interviews and online interviews. The online sampling is from a panel of respondents, so their participation does not adhere to usual assumptions associated with random selection. Therefore, it is not appropriate to assign a classical margin of sampling error for the results. In this case, the SRC provides a credibility interval of plus or minus 4.1 percentage points to account for a traditional 95 percent confidence interval for the estimates (plus or minus 3.4 percentage points) and a design effect of 1.2 (based on the weighting). Credibility intervals for subsamples will be wider.
Are the data weighted?	Yes, relative to U.S. Census (2015 American Community Survey and Population Estimates Program) estimates for age, race, education, and gender. The data was also weighted to ensure that the mode of interview (live interviewer or online) was consistent between the weighted and unweighted data.
