Population represented	Adults (people over the age of 18) in North Carolina.
Sample size	1000 adults in North Carolina.
Mode of data collection	Online interviews. All interviews conducted in English.
Type of sample (probability/non-probability)	Non Probability, using a panel. Online Interviews included confirmation that respondent considered themselves residents of North Carolina.
Start and end dates of data collection	November 17 - 21, 2020.
Credibility interval for total sample	The online sample is from a panel of respondents, so their participation does not adhere to usual assumptions associated with random selection. Since it is not appropriate to assign a classical margin of sampling error for the results, the SRC provides a credibility interval of plus or minus 3.2 percentage points to account for a traditional 95% confidence interval for the estimates (plus or minus 3.1 percentage points) and a design effect of 1.06 (based on the weighting).
Are the data weighted?	Yes, relative to NC Census statistics for gender, age, race, and ethnicity. The weighting also took into account education level (using NC Census data).
