Rationale for above changes

The department of Exercise Science (EXS) has recently undergone a name change – Health & Human Performance (HHP). Historically, the evolution of BMC, EPY, NTR, and WEL was intended to create cognates to align with the creation of concentrations (BS.EXS.EPY, EXS.BMC) and the prospect of developing a major in nutrition (NTR). The necessity of maintaining these respective course call letters is no longer relevant based on the existing structure of curriculum. Second, the consolidation of BMC, EPY, EXS, NTR, WEL would simplify the listings of courses in the UG Bulletin and Student Planning. It would be easier for students to identify department courses during the registration process.
