It has been determined by all parties that engineering students will no longer take a separate Calculus course from other students. Discussions surrounding this issue began in September 2024, and Fall 2024 was the last offering of MTH 1415. Now, all engineering students are taking MTH 1410: Calculus I alongside students in other majors. Since MTH 1415 was only a fall-semester course, this allows better flexibility for students beginning their freshman year at the precalculus level.
