Competency Based Course Assignments Starting Spring 2025

CAHME accreditation requires that the MHA program evaluates student knowledge and competencies while students are in the MHA program. CAHME Standard III.C.2 states: "The Program will regularly evaluate the extent to which each student attains the competencies at the level targeted by the program and will have a process in place for communicating that information to students." Each course will focus on 2–3 program learning objectives, as each course does today, and design a competency-based course assignment to determine each student's achievement of knowledge in the course. The assignment will be rated by both faculty and students using the following scale:

Novice: The student understands and values the topic, able to explain it.

Competent: The student can teach key topics in the workplace or to other MHA students.

Advanced Knowledge: The student demonstrates comprehensive integration of specialized course topics.

At the end of each course, the course instructor reviews with each student, their competency scores for that specific course. Students will continue to receive their regular course grades.
