CAHME Update

Our program recently completed the CAHME accreditation site visit, which resulted in very positive feedback and was described as thorough, rigorous, and highly informative.

Key post-site visit areas of continued growth and enhancement include:

- Expanded integrative learning experiences
- Enhanced professional development opportunities with healthcare practitioners
- Increased team-based and applied learning activities

During the Public Announcement of Findings, the review team shared its recommendation that our program be granted accreditation status and will forward it to the CAHME Board of Directors, which makes the final decision.

The official accreditation decision is anticipated in mid-fall 2026.
