Credibility interval for total sample	Approximately +/-3.2 percentage points. This accounts for a standard margin of sampling error of 3.1 (as if it were a probability sample) and a design effect caused by weighting.
Are the data weighted?	The data is weighted toward population parameters for age, gender, education, race, and ethnicity published by the U.S. Census. The SRC produces weights through an iterative procedure within SPSS.
