HIGH POINT UNIVERSITY POLL 117: MEMO RELEASE	
Population represented:	Adults (people over the age of 18) in North Carolina and the United States
Sample size:	1,000 adults in North Carolina (831 individuals who confirmed they are registered to vote).
Mode of data collection:	Online interviews were collected using a single survey instrument within High Point University's Qualtrics account. Interviews were conducted in English and Spanish.
Type of sample:	Non-probability sample from Kantar's online panel (North Carolina, USA).
Dates of data collection:	January 9 - January 21 2026
Credibility interval for all adult sample:	Approximately +/- 3.3 percentage points. This accounts for a standard margin of sampling error of 3.1 (as if it were a probability sample) and a design effect (1.1) caused by weighting. These are attempts to estimate error from the nature of the sample. Additional factors such as question wording and other methodological choices in conducting survey research can introduce additional errors into the findings of opinion polls.
Data quotas and weighting:	High Point University's SRC worked with Kantar to fill quotas for age, gender, education, race, and ethnicity. The data are weighted to match population parameters for age, gender, race, education, and ethnicity published by the U.S. Census for North Carolina. The High Point University Survey Research Center (SRC) produces weights through an iterative procedure within SPSS.
Survey sponsor and funded by:	High Point University, High Point, NC.
Human response authentication:	HPU Polls include at least one CAPTCHA in addition to Qualtrics' internal controls, including reCAPTCHA. Kantar uses its own methods to screen panel respondents. The SRC uses other protocols to screen out non-human respondents.

Survey/Data collection supplier:	High Point University's SRC created the survey instrument, which was approved by the HPU Institutional Review Board . Interviews collected through the High Point University SRC, recording responses in Qualtrics. Kantar's online panel invited respondents.
Sample supplier:	Online panel (North Carolina, USA) provided by Kantar. Respondents were compensated according to their agreements with Kantar.
Commitment to transparency:	The HPU Poll reports methodological details in accordance with the standards set out by AAPOR's Transparency Initiative , and the HPU Survey Research Center is a Charter Member of the Initiative.
